## Joint Board October 14, 2025

Action item: Approve Revised NBR-001 Transfer Rules for E-Purse

Purpose: To clarify all transfer arrangements between all agencies.

**Background:** The transfer arrangements between the agencies were last approved by the Joint Board on March 25, 2005, for the legacy ORCA system, and the next gen ORCA system adopted the same transfer rules as NBR-001.

Business Rules are reviewed and revised from time to time based on the ORCA System functionality and the needs of the ORCA Agencies.

Action: This action revises NBR-001 as follows:

- 1. Documents existing exceptions to transfer rules for Washington State Ferries and Kitsap Transit Fast Ferry services.
- 2. Adds Seattle Center Monorail to the list of services exempted from these regional transfer rules. As such, riders will pay the full fare when using a per-trip payment method to ride the Monorail regardless of fares paid during the rest of their trip.
- 3. Clarifies and documents the valid transfer period as two hours.
- 4. Clarifies and documents that these transfer rules apply regardless of the type of payment credential used. Physical ORCA cards, digital ORCA cards, and Open Payments will all be beholden to these transfer rules.

**Recommendation:** The ORCA Business Managers recommend approval of the revised NBR-041 ORCA Card Graphics for Transit Marketing.

Description	<ul> <li>These regional (inter-agency) transfer rules apply to all the agencies participating in the regional fare agreement, except Washington State Ferries, Kitsap Fast Ferries, and Seattle Center Monorail.</li> <li>Regional transfers will be valid for the same period of time on all participating agencies: 2 hours.</li> <li>A rider who uses E-purse value and transfers between agencies within the regional transfer period will receive a "cash value" for prior fare payment toward the fare on subsequent legs.</li> <li>Actual revenue received from each rider using E-purse will be shared among agencies providing service to that rider in proportion to the value of services provided as outlined in the system design documents. The "value of services provided" is calculated as the fare the rider would have paid in the absence of an intersystem transfer agreement.</li> </ul>
