Adult Fares

Tap to Pay customers are charged an Adult fare. Each rider will need their own card to pay. There are no RRFP categories or ORCA products that can be used/loaded.

Reduce wait times to buy fare and board for large events and peak travel times.



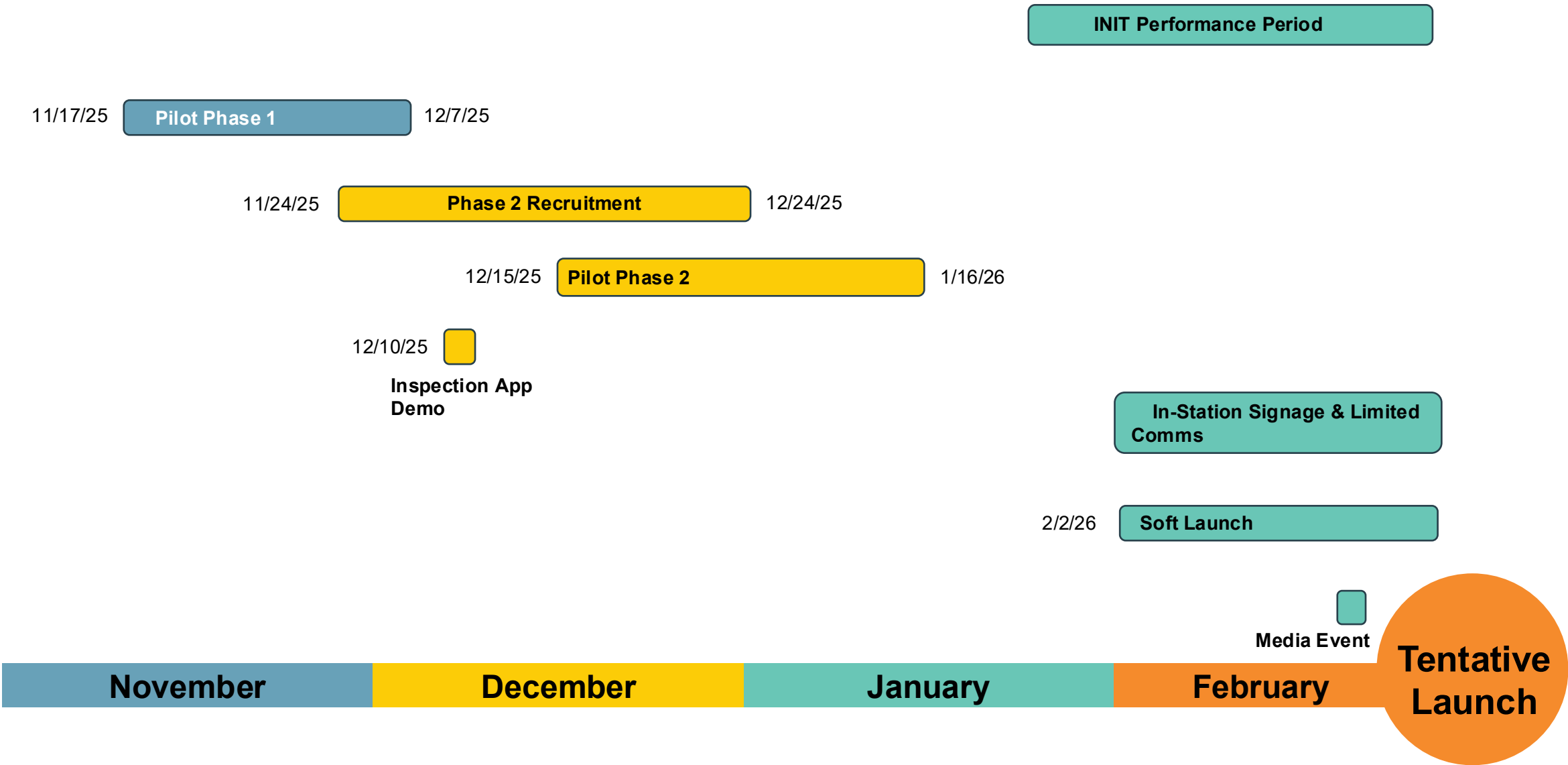
Allow groups to travel more easily together and customer familiarity. Contactless payments are already a well-known way to pay.

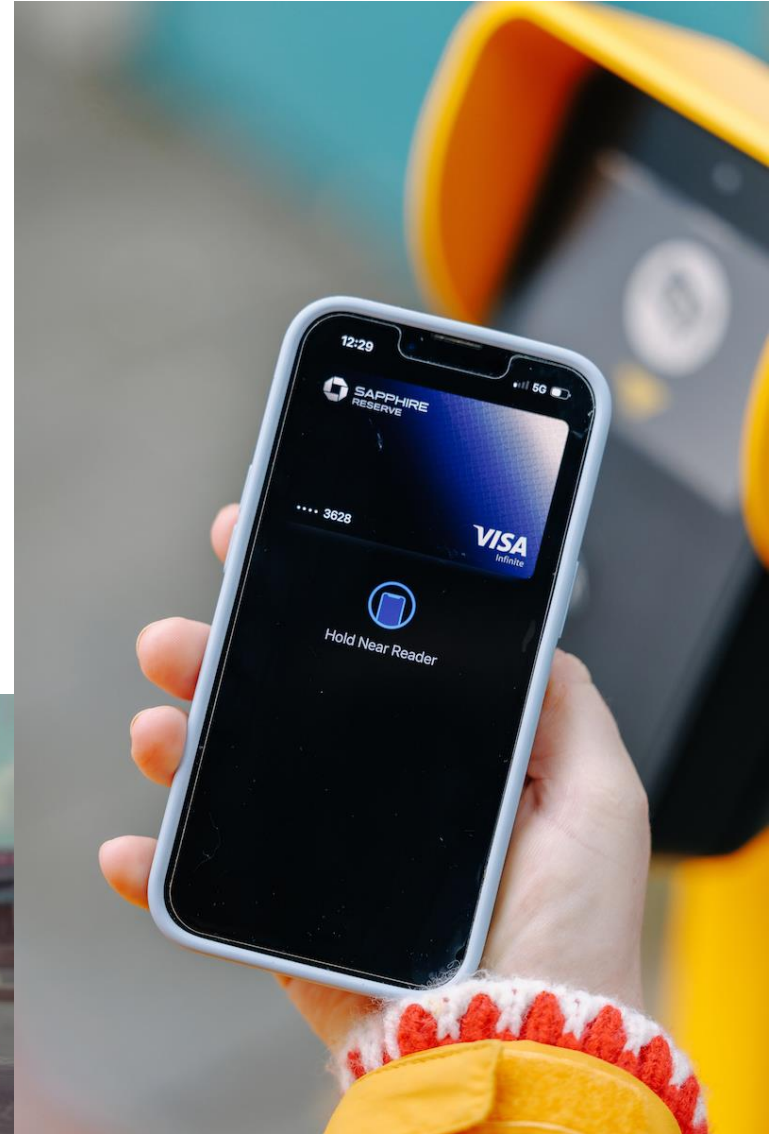
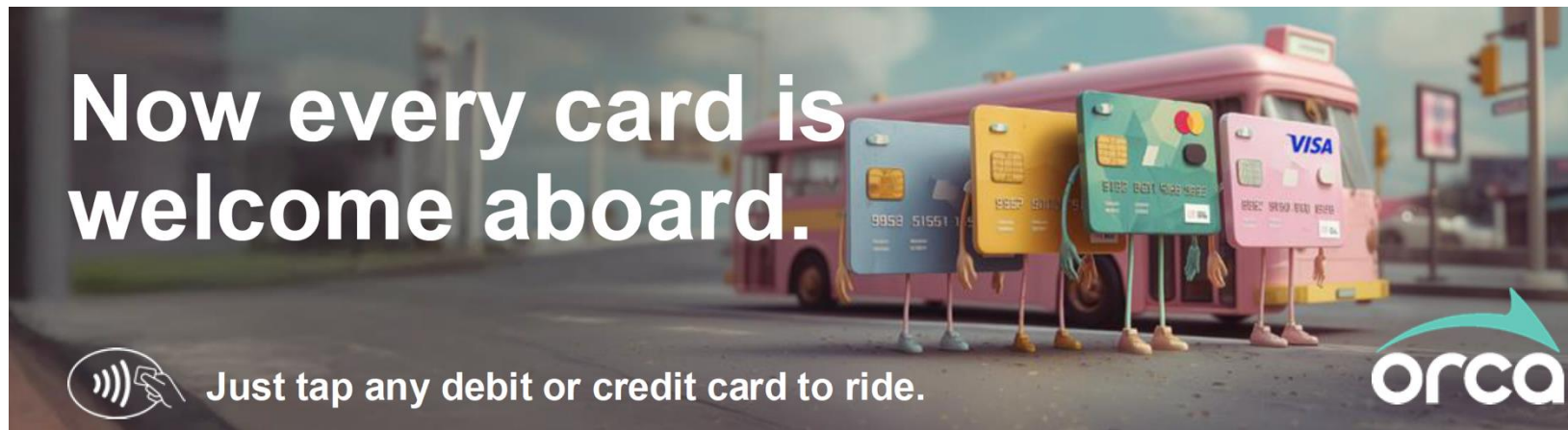
