Income documentation:

- Most recent 30 days pay stubs showing gross income
- Written statement from employer stating income (before taxes)
- Most recent tax return if self employed
- Unemployment benefits letter
- Award letter from L&I, Social Security, or DSHS

If you currently have no income and are not receiving any state benefits, Public Health can provide you with an Employment Security verification form, or you can provide your most recent quarter Employment Security Department report.

- Passport
